Dear Sir,

Attached is a copy of my recent letter to Com. Bob Paulson, of the RCMP regarding the sad yet true ordeal that I am living with since 9/11/2001. Apparently my file has been left open because the government of Canada is still unwilling to take responsibility for the irreparable damages that has been caused by some civil servants who went out of their way to allege that I was a "Security Risk". I am writing to you on the basis that you are not only the Minister of Justice and the Attorney General of Canada but also on the basis that you personally were familiar with my case from the very beginning. Indeed you made many valuable contributions to the Parliament arguments in support of my case during that time as you can see on the below youtube video.

During the above-noted Parliament discussions concerning my case you stated the following facts to the Parliament:

1. I (Mohamed Attiah) was wrongly accused.
2. I (Mohamed Attiah) suffered irreparable damages as a result of the above.

3. Finally you raised a very important issue to the government in the form of a question i.e. what course of action is available for me and others who have been wrongly accused?

Although the government responded by referring to the standard routine of civil litigation, I do believe that you meant to urge the government to provide a faster, fairer and more effective course of action for those who have been wrongly accused beyond the existing costly routine of civil litigation which is prone to many potential sources of abuse to the process as you can from my attached letter to Commissioner Paulson. You boldly asked that the government should avoid the trap of subjecting the victims to the further long term victimization involved in costly, painful and the – often- abuse or imperfections in the legal process. This is how best I can understand and interpret your statements on the above–referenced video record.

The fact that the government has not yet been able to provide me with justice by taking responsibility for their wrong-doing is the

strongest evidence and proof that corroborates your insight and your vision as expressed by your statements to the parliament then.

With due respect, I am offering the following suggestions to simplify my case and to provide some sense of justice to me and to my children as the victims of this bizarre situation:

- a) Clear my name immediately. This has been long overdue and your testimony in the parliament is my best evidence for the fairness and reasonableness of this request.
The status quos i.e. leaving my file open continues to be a source of serious problems for me whenever I may decide to travel anywhere in the world.
Additionally and in the light of recent news and developments unfolding regarding the military coup and the associated violations of civil liberties in Egypt, the status quos becomes a very serious concern if I may contemplate to visit my extended family in Egypt.
- b) Refer my case to an independent committee or expert panel to investigate my case objectively and to decide on how I might be fairly compensated considering the hardships and damages I am incurring due to the ongoing torture against me since 2001.

I am looking forward to your ongoing support.
